### Aldermen call for power to appoint chiefs

Milwaukee aldermen called Tuesday for state lawmakers to give the city's mayor the power to appoint police and fire chiefs, wresting that authority from the Fire and Police Commission.

Supporters have said it's time to change the system to ensure the chiefs are more accountable to elected officials for public safety services. But Ald. Joe Davis Sr. said it's the commission that should be held accountable for what he called a string of pad decisions, including the recent move to let a new, unnamed candidate apply or police chief after applicaions were closed and the
